


# What do YOU think about the programme?

53 responses received.




# Profile of respondents: country of work




Sector of work




Gender




# Profile of respondents: role in the programme




## Highest value-added activities on A2F

Mobilisation of experts **sharing international practices, tools** and supporting the dialogue **technically** proved valuable.



Identifying and disseminating tools that could be operationalized quickly at national level	4.02

## **Conclusions**

- A closer alignment with national priorities is needed
  -> involve SBACs in formulation of the next regional programmes
